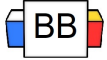

What are copulative conjunctions?

- Copulative conjunctions (additive conjunctions) are coordinating conjunctions that show something has been added.
- The conjunction denotes that the second word, phrase, clause, or sentence conveys a fact linked to the first.

There are a few copulative conjunctions:

- Furthermore
- Also
- And
- Plus

Comma Rules

Use a comma to separate the copulative conjunction if it does the following functions:

1. Starts a sentence as more of an adverbial (comma placed after the word).

Example: Furthermore, I stole the candy.

Example: Also, I crashed the car.

2. Joins two independent clauses (comma placed before the word).

Example: I need to talk to him, plus he has my gardening gloves.

Example: I can't wait for my birthday, and I'm going to have the biggest party.

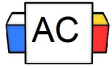
